As I am assuming that some of you out there do actually enjoy these things, I am continuing on with a new project - the complete piano-vocal score of *The Mountebanks...* For those of you who think that the only reason to pay attention to *The Mountebanks* is Gilbert's libretto, you are in for a surprise - Cellier's score is very enjoyable indeed, and (considering how long he spent in Sullivan's shadow) very different (at least to my ear) from Sullivan in style.

I suspect Cellier was very concerned about following Sullivan as Gilbert's first new composer in years, and may have known he had not long to live. The combination may well have inspired him; the score is certainly finer than that for *After All*, which you can also listen to in MIDI format at the archive. Of course I have never heard a note of *Dorothy* so I can't compare that to *Mountebanks*.

SORCERER INCANTATION SCENE FLIES AGAIN! The 11/19 issue of *The Boston Globe* contains a note about the **Boston Academy of Music** double-bill of *TRIAL* and *SORCERER* which will be mounted on Friday, Saturday and Sunday of Thanksgiving-Day weekend. Seems that **Richard Conrad**, BAM's guiding spirit, decided to use the Incantation Scene from Act II of *SORCERER*, and asked **Kyle Hoepner** to compose music for the libretto, since Sullivan's original music is lost.

According to the Globe, "Hoeppner used a church anthem by Sullivan, "O Love the Lord," as a starting point, constructing and deconstructing it, and composing his own Sullivanesque recitative and music in order to create a convincing dramatic continuity. Conrad believes this will be the first performance ever of this scene." [Actually, it won't be the first: David Larrick of the Sudbury Savoyards composed music for that piece, at Our request, in 1991, and it was performed at Sudbury in March of 1992. But what was worth doing once is, We're sure, worth doing again - and Maestro Hoepner's method is certainly ingenious!
